


- Through this experience I learned heavily about social media in Europe

- I learned to work well in the environment I was given




I worked on shipping cost analysis for 200+ products

 I gained experience using excel and google sheets






I researched all previous customers in the UK as a form of Market research to follow these accounts on Instagram and find potential influencers for the Y-Strap
